

GUIDELINES FOR PLAQUES AT SPECIALTY SHOW

CCA will offer a BOB plaque (or BOV plaques) and a HIT plaque (if obedience is offered at the local specialty) to CCA Member Clubs for presentation n at their specialties. If notified by the member club in a timely manner; and if the CCA award(s) is published in the local member club's premium list, a copy of which must be received by the awards committee.

SURVEY RESULTS

The goal of the survey is to learn factors that influence our members attendance at the national, whether the membership would consider adding another day to their show weekend to attended seminars and enter in 4-6 puppies, and what types of events respondents were likely to participate in. And lastly, we wanted to know what the maximum amount per night respondents were willing to spend, and what was considered a realistic number of dogs per room.

At the time of the survey, CCA had 320 members. Of the 320 members, 124 completed the survey (38.7% of our membership). Of those who participated in the survey, over the last five years 9.86% not attended a national, 16.13% attended once, 16.13% attended twice, 17.74% attended three (3) times, 11.29% four (4) times, and 29.03% have attended five (5) times. The majority of participants (65.22%) drive to the national, with 35.65% flying in, and the remaining 13.04% traveling via motorhome.

Respondents were then asked to select the factors which influence their decision to attend the national. The results are as follows: Location 72.13%, Judging Panel 63.11%, having the hotel on Same grounds as show site 58.20%, having animals to exhibit 55.74%, cost of Hotel per night 40.16%, cost of travel 28.69%, number of dogs allowed in room 27.87 %, Personal reasons (vacation, time off, etc) 27.05%, shuttle transport to/from airport to hotel 18.85%, distance of show site from major airport 17.21%, and availability of motorhome parking 17.21%.

Next, we asked four questions relating to an additional day, and types of events the respondents were likely to attend. 67.48% of respondents would consider adding an additional day to attend seminars, and 53.72 % are willing to enter 4-6 month puppy. Respondents were then asked to rate their likeliness of attending five (5) events at the national.

And lastly, we were interested in the number of dogs per room the membership felt was reasonable, and what the membership was willing to spend per night. 48.76% of respondents felt 8-10 dogs was reasonable, 17.36% 6-8 dogs, 23.97% 4-6 dogs, and 9.92% 2-4 dogs. In terms of hotel room cost, 55.08% of respondents are willing to spend a maximum amount of \$90-114 per night for a hotel room; 27.97% up to \$130, 10.17% up to \$150, and 7.63% up to \$200 per night.

All of this information is being used for planning future Regional and National specialties in October. As I was interested in whether the 9.86% of respondents who have not attended in the last five (5) years responses differed from the overall population, I did compare that populations responses with the overall responses. While there were a few differences, I did not find an overall significant difference between the two groups. Two of the difference were as followed: In the question regarding reasons for attending, Personal (vacation, time off, etc) ranked higher at 45.45%. And in regards to 4-6 Puppy, only 44.44% were likely to enter compared to the 53.72% of the overall population. And in terms of likeness to attend certain events, only 55% were likely to attend the welcome party compared to 75.42% of the overall population; and 75% were likely to attend a Handling seminar versus 55.26% of the overall population.

HEALTH COMMITTEE REPORT AUGUST 14TH, 2019

General Committee Business:

The committee is asking that if you have an epileptic chihuahua in your household and meet the following criteria:

- Households must have one dog with epilepsy and one unaffected dog
- Epileptic dog must have presumptive diagnosis of idiopathic epilepsy based on seizure onset between 6 months and 6 years of age, and not be on seizure medication or be on phenobarbital alone
- Both dogs must not be on any other medications aside from monthly preventatives

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON GRAIN FREE "boutique" DIETS:

The CCA Health Committee would like to make you aware (if you are not already informed) of the health hazards of feeding grain-free foods which include legumes such as peas, chickpeas, lentils, potatoes & sweet potatoes which have been implicated since July 2018 in the deaths of many dogs from DCM (Dilated Cardiomyopathy). We plan to get more information up on the website regarding this in the near future & below is a link to introduce you to this information if you are unfamiliar.

The cases of DCM range in ages from 9 months to senior dogs of small and large breeds and mixed breeds. The veterinarians and scientists are strongly recommending staying with the 'big 4' dog food companies (Purina, Royal Canin, lams/Eukanuba, & Science Diet) until their studies learn more about the causes of the dogs' deaths from DCM. Some dogs' DCM has been reversed when the dogs have been placed back on grain-inclusive foods if it is not too far advanced. There are often NO clinical signs, the dogs just drop dead.

Submitting all 3 results together can be done for a reduced fee of \$22.50 total vs. The individual application fees.

RESCUE COMMITEE LYNNIE BUNTEN

Wow! What a summer. In June, Wade Davis of Davishall Chihuahuas passed away. He left over 50 dogs, mostly Chihuahuas, Sadly. they were receiving minimal care and kept in poor housing. Someone was coming to the site three times a week and replenishing food and water, but little more. There is no Chihuahua rescue group in Louisiana that I've been able to identify, but this story ends well. Whoever was "caring" for the dogs contacted the Heart of Louisiana Humane Society (HLHS) for help. HLHS called on another group, Central Louisiana Alliance for Animals (C.A.F.A) to go out to Davis' place the day after Wade died. With a surrender form signed by the caretaker, the two groups worked their way through heavy vegetation and took all 59 dogs. They have provided veterinary care, foster homes and love for these poor dogs. Many suffered from skin conditions and many were heartworm positive. I researched and then contacted these two groups and just asked, "How can we help?" They told me, of course, and I asked the CCA Board if we could send some of our rescue fund to each of these groups to help with the dogs' care. Of course the Board authorized it. I asked for between \$500 and \$1000 for each of the two groups and the Board gave \$1000 for each. I personally donated and have spread the word to encourage others to help as well.

The dogs are doing well and learning how to be cared for properly and how to accept love and affection. Some have been adopted while the rest are in foster care.

I am thrilled to have found these two amazing groups. Sometimes rescue folks are suspicious of those of us who breed and show. I would like to locate more groups like this around the country and begin to open communication channels. Chihuahua Club of America doesn't do direct rescue. Few of our member clubs are able to do that either. We can, however, help discover what groups out there in our communities that are willing to work with us and willing to accept our support. I want to call on you all to take a look around your community and see if there is a rescue group with a good reputation, strong organizational structure and a willingness to accept help and to let us know when there is a Chihuahua situation that could use some of our help. In the past, I've seen many of you offer help and we haven't had much of a structure to help with it.

So, feel free to call, write, email or text me to talk about how we can better help individual Chihuahuas in need.
