

We have seated our Nominating committee and are looking forward to the





# "SHOW DOGS AND STUD DOGS"

by Richard G. (Rick) Beauchamp



A STUD DOG IS NOT SIMPLY A MALE DOG. Neither do show records or championships have anything to do with a dog's producing ability. Winning in the show ring proves the dog has the quality necessary to win. Siring outstanding offspring is the only thing that proves a sire's ability. These are two entirely different qualities.

dog can be a truly great show dog and a poor sire. A dog can hate the show ring and never win a point and be an outstanding sire. It is just as simple as that. The biggest mistake breeders, novice or veteran, can make is to confuse their show dogs with their breeding dogs. They can be the same. We hope they will be the same. Often they are not

There are those who say show wins are the indicator of a dog's value to the breed. In other words, if many judges agree a particular dog is the current ideal in its breed, the dog should be bred to. I agree - but only to a degree.

You can get every judge in the country to agree that the dog of the hour is the dog of the hour, but that same dog can be a complete disappointment in the breeding department. If a dog's quality is not realized in the whelping box, all we have is a box full of ribbons and nothing more.

This is not to say a winning dog cannot also be an outstanding producer. Records prove otherwise. But I cannot stress strongly enough that it is the producing ability that must be looked to and not the show record!

Even the outstanding sire can be misused. Most breeds have had those truly wonderful show dogs who develop records that become the envy of one and all. Unfortunately, they become the envy of too many who feel if a dog is good enough to win every award in sight, it must be good enough to breed every bitch in sight.

In a way, the popular stud dog that produces well only with certain bitch lines can be very destructive to a breed. A few excellent youngsters emerge from the right combination and the parade begins. Every bitch that can see lightning and hear thunder is bred to the dog, but the percentage of quality produced is minuscule. The breed takes a big step backward.

This is actually not the fault of the sire, but of the owners of the many bitches who follow the parade to the popular sire, regardless of the fact that he would in fact be the last choice for their particular bitch.

Truly great sires are really few and far between. There's an old saying I heard somewhere along the way that goes something like, "You can breed that one to a fence post and you'll still get good pups." They are the rare ones, the ones that any breed is lucky to have, but it is highly doubtful that any breed will have such a dog any more than once in any breeder's lifetime.

This no doubt all sounds perfectly logical, but I could write whole books on the excuses young breeders make for not breeding to the correct dog for their bitch: snow storms, rain storms, typhoons and earthquakes; the correct dog's third cousin lives down the street; it's just her first season and I'm "proving" her; etc., etc., etc.

There is only one breeding worth making
the right one. When it comes time to breed
your quality bitch, stop and think, what if
this turns out to be the only litter she will
ever have!"

# SPERM ANATOMY & MORPHOLOGY: EVALUATING FOR BREEDING SOUNDNESS



As breeders we all should be evaluating sperm collections regularly on all our stud dogs. After all, you know very well it is <u>always</u> the stud dog's fault if the breeding doesn't take! That of course was sarcasm but none the less true that the stud dog will be blamed by breeders, but not always the fault of the male. Evaluation of collected semen from your stud dog (s) can either ease your mind or identify any problems. Examination should include volume, color, concentration or "count", motility, & morphology.

#### Morphology

Morphology, in biology, the study of the size, shape, and structure of animals, plants, and microorganisms and of the relationships of their constituent parts. The term refers to the general aspects of biological form and arrangement of the parts of a plant or an animal. In the context of semen evaluation, understanding these values will enable us to recognize and identify abnormalities.

#### SPERM ANATOMY




Above: Normal canine spermatozoon ( ×1000) under microscope. *Photo Credit: D.B. DeNicola, Purdue University* 

The normal spermatozoa consists of the acrosomal cap, head, neck, middle piece, and tail as shown in the photos below. The acrosome is a cap like structure covering slightly more than the anterior half of the head, and the middle piece is approximately 1.5 times the length of the head in normal spermatozoa. Individual spermatozoa should be evaluated for abnormalities arising in the head, middle piece, and tail. Commonly identified abnormalities include detached heads, knobbed acrosomes, detached acrosomes, proximal and distal cytoplasmic droplets, reflex (i.e., bent) midpiece, bent tails, tails tightly coiled over the midpiece, and proximally coiled tails (Root Kustritz et al. 1998).


Spermatozoon anatomy in more specific detail *Photo Credit: Infinity Canine, NC* 

#### PRIMARY VS. SECONDARY DEFECTS

Primary defects are the more severe and are thought to originate while the sperm was still within the testis. Secondary defects are less serious and thought to arise during passage thought the epididymis or by mishandling after ejaculation. Some controversary exists over the physiologic basis of this pattern of classification. Examples of primary spermatozoal defects are *a*bnormal head with multiple tails, and coiled tail. Abnormal head; bent middle piece and tail of spermatozoon with normal head are secondary defects. Other examples of secondary spermatozoal defects are, bent tail, distal cytoplasmic droplets; bent tail, and a detached normal head.


Proven male stud dogs will have abnormal sperm. It is important to note that every dog will have some percentage of abnormal sperm, but we want that number to be small and if it is a high percentage to know the possible cause. A minimum of 200 spermatozoa should be counted and classified in a sperm evaluation. Some abnormal sperm may have defects in more than one site.

As a rule, ideally normal males generally should have greater than 70% morphologically normal spermatozoa and that primary and secondary abnormalities should constitute less than 10% and 20% of the defective sperm. It has been found that fertility of dogs was statistically reduced when the percentage of morphologically normal sperm fell below 60%. Mickelsen et al (1993) found that total numbers of morphologically normal and progressively motile spermatozoa per ejaculate was more important in predicting fertility. Artificial insemination with greater than  $250 \times 10^6$  morphologically normal sperm resulted in a pregnancy rate of approximately 82% in 27 bitches evaluated. Obviously, total sperm per ejaculate and health of the spermatozoa (i.e., morphology, motility) are all critical in the assessment of fertility of the dog.

#### Let's Kill the Breeder Myths!

Genetics can be complicated. The more you know about what's going on under the hood, the better decisions you will be able to make the next time you plan a litter.

This would seem obvious, but in fact there are many nuggets of old "wisdom" that get passed around and around that are, well...not true. Yet, like a fly in the kitchen, it seems no amount of swatting at these untruths will get rid of them.

Breeder! Unburden yourself of these myths! Embrace truth and science! Read on!

#### **Common Breeder Myths**

You've probably heard all of these. You've probably even repeated some of them. We will examine each of them.

#### Myth #1 "Breed only BEST to BEST"

Look, don't breed the dogs that have no good points. But just like in school, realize that there can be a lot of merit in "above average". In fact, if the parents of a litter were quality dogs, then the offspring inherited quality genes, but perhaps not always in the best combination. Don't toss out those valuable genes - mixed a bit differently, they could produce the next superior animal. Remember: Improvement through selection requires genetic variation. Keep a good variety of ingredients in the genetic pantry to choose from!

#### THE TRUTH: Selection requires genetic variation.

#### Myth #2: "Inbreeding is required to fix type"

The genes for breed type should be fixed in the first few generations after breed formation. Once the breed has the qualities that define it, further inbreeding simply increases homozygosity in the other "dog" genes, for things like toenails and kidneys and glucose metabolism and saliva. If there are some mutations among the thousands of genes in the dog (and of course, there are!), then inbreeding will inadvertently produce paired (homozygous) mutations for some genes. For these, whatever the normal gene is supposed to do will be broken.

Other domestic animals have clearly recognizable breeds with much lower levels of inbreeding than are typical in dogs. Most purebred dog breeds have average inbreeding in excess of 12%, and about half of the breeds are greater than 25%. In horses, most breeds are less than 12%.

#### THE TRUTH: Inbreeding can break things. Use it wisely.

#### Myth #3: Close the stud book to protect the breed

If the stud book is closed, genes will be lost from the gene pool through selective breeding and "genetic drift" (chance). If you start a breed with a founder gene pool, then lose genes every generation that cannot be replaced, eventually the gene pool will be depleted. You can easily test this with a bowl of M&M's on the coffee table. Grab a

few when you need that chocolate fix, but don't put any back. Eventually, the bowl will be empty.

The rule of thumb here: Animals in closed gene pools go extinct.

Really? Is this always true??? In fact, no. There is a very famous herd of cattle in England, the Chillingham cattle, that has survived for centuries as a closed gene pool. They are the iconic exception. But every other closed population has gone extinct, and yours will too. You can count on it.

#### THE TRUTH: Animals in closed gene pools go extinct.

#### Myth #4: "I know what's in my line"

You probably know about dominant alleles. They mask the expression of recessive alleles. You cannot know what recessive alleles are lurking in your gene pool as long as expression is masked by a dominant allele. You could unmask recessives using inbreeding, because as we saw above, inbreeding breaks things. Or you could avoid inbreeding, not worry about the recessive lurkers, and keep that doggy working like a well-oiled machine.

#### THE TRUTH: You can't know what's in your line.

#### Myth #5: Outcrossing introduces new diseases

Outcrossing does not "introduce new diseases". It introduces new alleles, some of which will probably be recessive mutations. But single mutations do not usually produce disease. In fact, as noted above, most recessive mutations are masked by dominant, normalfunctioning alleles and produce no ill effects. Eliminate this problem by following a simple rule of genetic management: keep recessive mutations rare. So no popular sires!

And remember from above: Inbreeding breaks things.

#### THE TRUTH: Keep recessive mutations rare.

#### MYTH #6: Hybrid vigor doesn't apply to dogs

Hybrid vigor results when you "undo" inbreeding by mating two animals that are relatively unrelated. Inbreeding applies to dogs. So hybrid vigor applies to dogs.

No, it hybrid vigor does not require different species. In fact, most interspecific hybrids are infertile and not terribly vigorous. Nothing will make you look dumber than declaring that hybrid vigor doesn't apply to dogs. Do yourself a favor. Look this one up. So you never forget.

#### THE TRUTH: Yes, hybrid vigor applies to dogs, too!



Cryptorchidism is a condition in which a male's testicles have not descended (dropped) into the scrotumand is one of the most common birth defects in purebred dogs. An estimated frequency of this abnormality in several breeds is as high as 4-15%. Dog breeds most likely to be affected include Yorkshire terrier, Pomeranian, Poodle, Siberian husky, miniature schnauzer, Shetland sheepdog, Chihuahua, German shepherd, Dachshund, and brachycephalic breeds, but it can happen in any breed or mixed breed.

In utero, a male puppy's testicle starts up by the kidney, and at birth, the testicle should be located near the inguinal ring. By 8 weeks of age, both testicles should be in the puppy's scrotum, but this can occur later in some breeds. Descent rarely occurs after 6 months of age in any individual. About 75% of dogs are unilateral (one sided) vs 25% affected are bilateral (both sides).

Occasionally a testicle can be normal at birth and a young age but reascend or move back up into the inguinal canal. A testis that can readily move or be moved between the scrotum and canal is referred to as retractile.

Because the retained testicle still produces male hormones, these animals have normal mating behavior and sexual characteristics. If only one testicle is retained (unilateral cryptorchidism), the dog can still mate normally, as the one normal testicle will still produce normal sperm. A bilateral cryptorchid (occurring on both sides) animal is usually sterile because the higher body temperature inside the abdomen is enough to prevent sperm production.

## Understanding Cryptorchidism

#### **CAUSES:**

In the fetus, a structure called the gubernaculum connects the testicle (located next to the kidney during development) to the scrotum. If this structure fails to develop properly, the testicle will not end up in the scrotum, but will end up in the abdomen or the inguinal canal. The condition has a genetic basis and can be inherited from either parent. It is thought to be inherited as a sex-linked autosomal recessive trait with the exact mode of inheritance unknown.


#### **SIGNS:**

Signs are rarely apparent initially unless specifically looking for the testicles. Cryptorchidism is rarely associated with pain or other signs of disease early on. As an adult, infertility can become apparent and poor semen quality can be observed. Dogs can also present with acute signs of abdominal pain due to testicular torsion, with about 36% of dogs with torsion having a cancerous process.


Growing inguinal or abdominal masses are also common in the retained testicle. Sertoli cell tumors of retained testicles can cause feminization with alopecia of the trunk, development of mammary tissue, and hyperpigmentation of skin. Risk of testicular neoplasia is thought to be 10-14 times greater in cryptorchid dogs than in normal dogs.

#### **DIAGNOSIS:**

Physical examination and simple palpation is typically all that is required for diagnosis. Inguinal retained testicles are often palpable in the groin while abdominally retained testes are often not able to be palpated. The right testicle is most commonly affected if unilateral. Abdominal ultrasound can be used to find testicles not palpable. Surgical abdominal exploration is also often utilized when castrating males. Abdominally retained testicles are often found near the bladder during surgery. A testosterone assay can also be used to differentiate between a castrated male and a cryptorchid male.

Currently, there is no genetic diagnostic test to predict the risk of this disease in a dog or the progeny. The AKC Canine Health Foundation has studies with intent to develop DNA tests that may predict the risk of a dog or its offspring to develop cryptorchidism.

#### TREATMENT:

Surgical removal of both the retained and the scrotal testicle is recommended. Even if the animal is a unilateral cryptorchid, both testicles should still be surgically removed. The cryptorchid testicle should be removed to prevent testicular torsion and testicular cancer, and the normal testicle should be removed to prevent cryptorchid offspring. Castration is recommended by 4 years of age due to increasing risk of Sertoli cell tumor or seminomas in the retained testicle. This surgery is more complicated than the usual neuter surgery because the cryptorchid testicle can be difficult to locate. Generally two incisions are required for castration, a traditional prescrotal incision and an abdominal approach similar to that of a spay surgery.

There is anecdotal evidence that giving hCG orGnRH prior to 4 months of age can encourage testicle descent when given to dogs, but still gives rise to serious concern as to the genetic component of the disease. After 4 months of age, treatment is often unsuccessful

Orchiopexy, in which the testis is brought into the scrotum and sutured into place is considered unethical in dogs in AKC. Poor semen quality can be observed even after orchiopexy. Cryptorchid animals that have had both testicles removed, and have no other defects, will generally live a normal lifespan for the breed.

#### **BREEDING CONSIDERATIONS:**

If both testicles are affected, the dog is sterile. The parents of affected puppies should be considered carriers of the defect and a breeder should thoughtfully consider whether to breed the carrier parent or not. Littermates may be normal, carriers, or cryptorchid. Showing altered dogs in confirmation is against AKC rules. Because the condition is inherited, cryptorchid dogs should not be used for breeding.

#### IN SUMMARY:

Castration is recommended for affected males with cryptorchidism due to the genetic nature of the disease and increased risk of cancer in the retained testicle. Descent of the testicle after 4 months is rare, and after 6 months is unlikely.

#### **Farm Dog Title**

#### What is the Farm Dog Certified test?

The Farm Dog Certified test is open to all dogs at least 9 months of age that are individually registered with the AKC, recorded in the FSS program, dogs with PAL numbers, or dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners Program. The test is a non-competitive pass/fail evaluation designed to assess the overall conduct of a dog. The Farm Dog Certified test is designed to assess the overall conduct of a dog within a typical farm environment. The dog must demonstrate self-control when exposed to livestock and other unique sights, sounds and scents. The dog should exhibit confidence and a willingness to comply with instruction when confronted with a variety of situations. Dog must qualify under two different Judges in order to qualify to be awarded the FDC suffix title. The FDC test can be held in conjunction with an existing event (dog show or trial) or can be held as a stand-alone event.

This test involves your dog performing a series of 12 exercises that are typical for a farm environment such as being in close proximity to livestock (who are always penned to avoid any altercations); jumping and staying on hay/straw bales; walking on unusual terrain; and jumping over logs. There is no herding involved. Instead, the goal is to assess his aptitude as a working farm dog by exhibiting self-control, confidence and trust with you or his handler. Dogs are always on leash and livestock are always behind safe fencing. No direct contact between dog and livestock is allowed. The test time is typically 6 to 10 minutes per dog.

The Farm Dog Certified test provides for a series of twelve exercises that represent situations a farm dog would encounter in a typical farm environment. Test elements may be arranged in any order with the exception of the first and last element (#1 & #12)

#### **PERFORMANCE**

#### 1) GREET JUDGE – INITIAL DOG APPRAISAL

The handler approaches the Judge with the dog at side on a loose lead. The dog must not jump, or show aggression or excessive shyness

#### 2) PERFORM A WALKING PATTERN AROUND FARM ENVIRONMENT / PASSIVE STRANGER

The handler walks the dog on a loose lead at least 200 feet around a variety of objects and near a sitting person.

#### 3) JUMP ON HAY/STRAW BALE

The handler instructs the dog to jump up on the bale and stay until released by the judge

#### 4) WALK BY FARM ANIMALS

Handler walks the dog on a loose lead in view of penned farm

#### 5) WALK OVER OR THROUGH UNUSUAL SURFACES

The handler walks the dog over three different unusual surfaces such as a plastic tarp, a sheet of plywood, and metal grating lying flat on the ground.

#### 6) SUPERVISED SEPARATION

The handler places the dog in a free-standing kennel or dog crate, removes the leash and walks out of sight for a minimum of 1 minute

#### 7) PASS THROUGH A GATE

The dog stays while the handler opens the gate, passes through on the handler's command, and stays while the handler closes the gate

#### 8) HANDLER FEEDS LIVESTOCK

The dog is tethered while the handler approaches and feeds livestock in an enclosure.

#### 9) REACTION TO ANOTHER DOG

The dog remains stationary on a loose lead while another dog is walked by twice, about 10 feet away.

#### 10) REACTION TO NOISE DISTRACTION

The dog is exposed to two common farm sounds (such as hammering nails, leaf blowers, tractor engine, etc.) and must not panic

#### 11) DOG APPROACHES LIVESTOCK

The handler approaches penned livestock with the dog on a loose lead. The dog may not lunge or be fearful or aggressive to the stock.

#### 12) PHYSICAL EXAMINATION

The handler examines the dog for any plant material, debris or objects that the dog may have collected while working on the farm-examining the ears, eyes, mouth, coat and toes to ensure the dog is free of any foreign material such as grass, hay, burrs, etc.

If the dog passes the FDC test on two occasions under two different Judges, the owner may apply for the suffix Farm Dog Certified (FDC) title by submitting a FDC Title Application form and a nominal processing fee. Once verified, the FDC title will be applied to the dog's record and will appear on the dog's AKC pedigree

#### Summary

The Farm Dog Certified test provides for a series of exercises that represent situations a farm dog would encounter in a typical farm environment. The basic test requirements are designed to emphasize a dog's ability of self-control, confidence and trust necessary to succeed in any canine/human partnership. These traits and foundational training are vital to a working farm dog as well as the welfare of livestock.
