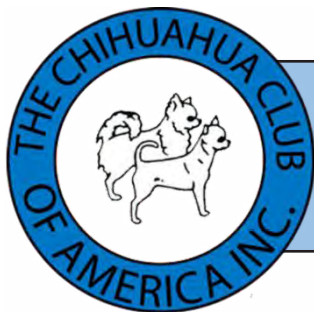

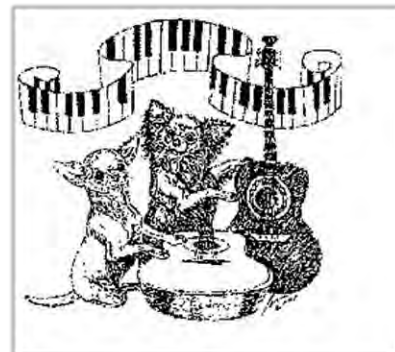

Florida: A Victory for Retired Police K-9s

In a win for Florida's retired law enforcement K-9s, Senate Bill 226/House Bill 25, also known as the "Care for Retired Police Dogs Program Act," was signed by Governor Ron DeSantis and enacted as Chapter No: 2022-188. It takes effect July 1, 2022

This legislation, supported by the American Kennel Club (AKC), establishes a program within the Department of Law Enforcement to work through a non-profit corporation to disburse funds for the veterinary care of qualified retired police dogs. It also appropriates a recurring annual sum of \$300,000 for this purpose.

AKC thanks Senator Bobby Powell and Representative Sam H. Killebrew for sponsoring this legislation, as well as co-sponsors Senators Burgess, Perry, Pizzo, Stewart, Torres, and Wright; and Representatives Arrington, Bartleman, Bell, Casello, Driskell, Duran, Eskamani, Fetterhoff, Geller, Hunschofsky, Massullo, Morales, Rayner, Silvers, Slosberg-King, D. Smith, Tant, Trabulsky, and Woodson.

MA Action Alert: Oppose Restrictions on Responsible Dog Ownership, Training and Breeding!

The Massachusetts Senate could soon consider a bill with negative impacts on owning, breeding, and training dogs. Massachusetts residents are strongly encouraged to use the information below to contact your State Senator TODAY and ask them to oppose Senate Bill 1322, as written.

Summary:

The Massachusetts Senate is being strongly encouraged to favorably pass SB 1322, in response to dog injuries and deaths at dog daycare facilities – one subset of "commercial boarding or training kennels" defined at MGL c. 140 § 136A, (which provides definitions for all Massachusetts municipal kennel licensing and oversight laws).

Preventing such tragedies ought to be a business priority, and the American Kennel Club (AKC) supports proper care and interaction with pets. However, SB 1322 has provisions specific to individual dog owners that would:

- restrict the right to own and keep dogs in a responsible and humane manner
- require compliance with future state rules on "responsible breeding practices"
- make broad and significant changes to state law that would result in duplicative kennel licenses

Furthermore, SB 1322 would impact a large variety of dog and cat businesses, in addition to daycare. Individually tailored approaches appropriately based on the pet service being provided are a more effective solution than adopting one-size-fits-all requirements for all “commercial boarding or training kennels”.

WHAT YOU CAN DO: Massachusetts residents are encouraged to find your State Senator’s email by inserting your address here. In your message, be certain to include the bill number, SB 1322, and your address so they know you are a resident in their district.

Here are some talking points:

- SB 1322 impacts individual dog owners and a variety of pet businesses, not just dog daycare, with uniform rules that may not be appropriate in every setting.
- Breeders take many steps, with a veterinarian, to ensure they are producing healthy, socialized dogs. It is not the purview of the state to determine breeding standards.
- Requiring towns to specify, upon inspection, the number of dogs a responsible owner may keep is unacceptable.
- Please oppose SB 1322, as written.

NY Senate Passes Debarking Ban – Call the Assembly Today!

Yesterday, due to some late procedural moves, the New York Senate passed a statewide ban on “debarking” – a veterinary practice also known as bark softening – unless it is medically necessary to treat an injury, illness, or congenital defect.

The bill now goes to the Assembly, where it has been assigned to the Assembly Agriculture Committee. While there are likely only a couple days left in session, it is essential for New York residents to contact their Assemblymember TODAY and let them know you are a constituent who opposes Senate Bill 9445. Use the online Member search tool to find the name and contact information for your State Assemblymember.

The AKC opposes Senate Bill 9445, which would restrict the rights of responsible dog owners to make viable, safe decisions on behalf of their pets in conjunction with their veterinarians. It also could force some owners to relinquish their dogs to shelters as opposed to keeping them in their homes.

Talking Points:

There is much misinformation about the veterinary procedure of debarking. *Debarking is a viable veterinary procedure that may allow a dog owner to keep a dog in its loving home rather than to be forced to euthanize or surrender it to a shelter when the pet's noisy behavior continually disrupts the community.*

Debarking should only be performed by a qualified veterinarian after behavioral efforts to correct a dog’s excessive barking have failed. As with other veterinary medical decisions, the decision to debark a dog is best left to individual owners and their veterinarians.

Working an Agility Trial

The most important volunteer position at a conformation show is that of ring steward yet only a small percentage of exhibitors have served as a ring steward. Almost all agility competitors have worked as scribe, timer, ring crew, or leash runner. At an agility trial it is customary for almost all competitors to sign up for these various duties in the downtime between their own runs. Most clubs give some type of worker credit, and some have worker raffles and worker refreshments.

You don't have to be entered in the agility trial or even know anything about agility to work at an agility trial. Working in one of these positions is a great way to learn about agility. Leash runner is probably the easiest position. In AKC agility all dogs run "naked" but must enter and exit the ring on lead. The entrance and the exit are always at different gates. It is the job of the leash runner to take the harness and leash or collar and leash from the entrance gate where it is cast aside just before the run to

the exit gate so that when finishing the run, the handler can put it back on to walk the dog out of the ring. Even Chihuahuas are expected to be walked in and out of the ring on a lead.








The next easiest job would be ring crew. Ring crew is needed to set up any bars which are knocked down by a dog during a run, to raise all the bars between heights, and to re-arrange all of the obstacles for course changes. During the run there are generally designated ring crew volunteers stationed in the ring. Being a ring crew volunteer gives you a whole different perspective on the trial. When changing courses generally at least five ring crew workers are needed. The more ring crew volunteers the more quickly and efficiently the trial runs.

The position of timer has been made easier using electronic timers which automatically start and end when the dog crosses the "eyes". If an automatic electronic timer is being used it is the responsibility of the timer to ensure that the "eyes" are both glowing green and the timer does start and stop as expected and then to record the time on the scorecard. It is extremely frustrating to run clean and fast only to find out that the timer wasn't working.

Finally, the most important and most difficult job is that of scribe. I have personally performed all these tasks and I enjoy all of them. When acting as scribe you absolutely must not watch the dog running the course, but only the judge. It is the job of the scribe to indicate on the scorecard of each dog whatever the judge calls via hand signals during the run. The most common signals the judge will give are refusal, off course, or failure to perform.

The inspiration for this article came to me yesterday when I attended an local agility trial briefly with my 4 and 6 year old granddaughters and one my retired Chihuahua moms so we could watch her son run. While I was there, and the jumps were being raised from 4" to 8" there was a lack of ring crew, and the judge was helping to raise bars. One person said, "the judge shouldn't have to set bars". I was unable to help because I had my hands full with two kids and one Chihuahua, but help is always appreciated and needed at an agility trial. It truly does take a village. If you'd like to learn more about agility attend a local trial and ask to help. You can start out as a leash runner and end up as a scribe.

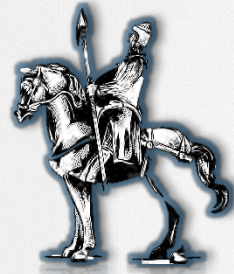

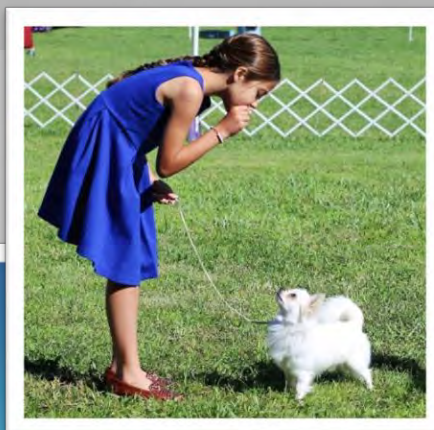

Her journey is very interesting, and we are all very excited to get to know a little bit more of her. I share with you this interview with our CCA member: Mrs. Kyle Potts, a dedicated and passionate breeder and exhibitor, who has achieved great results and has taken our breed to a national wide spotlight and deserving evidence. Enjoy it!

How long have you been a member of CCA?

I have been a member for 17 years and Tracy has been a member for 16 years.

How long have you participated in the Purebred Dog World?

I started showing in 1975. I began showing my own dogs. When Tracy and I married, I joined him in professional handling, and we did that for 20 years.

Which breeds have you owned and/or bred?

My first breed was German Shepherds. I decided after 6 years I would downsize to Pembroke Welsh Corgis. When I married Tracy in 1993, I was still showing my own Corgis. Tracy was already a professional handler, so I joined him, and my Corgis

took a side seat to our client dogs. We bought our first Chihuahua in 1999.

What is your kennel name?

Our dogs are registered under the Timeless prefix

Which one of your dogs is your all-time favorite and why?

That's a tough question, but I have to say it is our girl Star. GCHS Flo-Davi Star Spangled Glory ROM. Star was one of our first big winning dogs and by far, our best producer. She is a multiple group winner and won one Best in Show. She consistently produced better even better than herself. Bred only three times, she produced 10 puppies, 8 of them finished from the puppy class with 5 of them winning group placements and 1 picking up a Best in Show.

What win in conformation are you most proud of to date? And with which dog?

We have had our fair share of exciting wins. We have had several dogs with multiple All Breed Best in Show wins, but the win I am most proud of is the Chihuahua Club of America Rotating National Specialty in 2010. Our daughter Kirsten was 16 and competing in Junior Showmanship with Star at the time. We flew up to Wisconsin and she won Best of Variety Long Coat under the late great judge Sandra Goose Allen. Kirsten was the first Junior to win the variety at a CCA show with her Junior's dog.

Has COVID 19 resulted in any changes to your dog-related pursuits?

When Covid first hit, all dog shows were cancelled, and we had a "time out". That time helped us to focus more on our breeding program and get the new youngsters trained up and ready to go when the shows began again.

What do you enjoy most about our Sport?

The family that I have built with other exhibitors. Kirsten attended her first show at 1 week of age. Several other handlers and judges helped raise our daughter. They watched her on weekends when we were in the ring. They trained her right alongside us and they treated her as their own. Our dog show family is a tight one. We cheer for each other; we weep with each other, and we will stand and fight for each other when needed.

What is the hardest part of the standard to breed for consistency?

Fronts. I think it is very easy to lose a good front structure and it can take generations to breed it back in. Often breeders are focused on a head or a plush coat or extreme action when moving. I value a well-set shoulder and level top line above almost anything else.

What do you see as trending in the breed today – good and bad?

On the good side, topline are improving and rears are getting cleaned up. Heads are trending more toward our standard of moderation. On the bad side, I see too many fronts well forward

of where they need to be, resulting in hackney type action. When you see a photo of a dog moving from the side and the front foot is noticeably higher off the ground than the rear foot in motion...that is not correct movement. Too often I hear people comment how lovely the picture is, when in fact, it is not what our standard calls for.

What has been the most significant change in our sport since you got your first dog? Knowing what you know now, would you do this all over again?

I think that the race for rankings has taken on a whole new life of its own. I see owners showing lesser quality dogs one right after the other in a race to finish as many as they can, just to earn a title or ranking. I see people chasing dreams of being on top. I miss the days of being able to sit ringside watching all the groups, discussing dogs, and comparing notes. We need to slow down and enjoy what brought us to this sport in the first place. Tracy and I have been able to dial back to that time since we quit our professional handling. We show our own dogs now, and from time to time, we may show one for a friend. UNDERSTANDING YOUR DOG'S BLOODWORK

We have all been there. You have a sick dog you have taken to the vet, the vet orders bloodwork on your dog, and your vet hands you the printed results. But do you know what all those acronyms on your report stand for and what exactly does it tell the vet? It can be intimidating, frustrating, and overwhelming. I will attempt to simplify some of this for you so you can have a better understanding of it. Your own bloodwork report will look remarkably like your dog's report so hopefully this little lesson will help you to have an advantage regarding your own test results as well! Knowledge is power.

Types of Bloodwork

Complete Blood Count (CBC)

I am sure most of you are familiar with the CBC. The complete blood count provides a wealth of information. It is analysis of red and white blood cells. It is a count of the cells, and the measure of hemoglobin, which is oxygen carrying ability of the red blood cells. An elevated white blood cell count could indicate infection. A CBC also evaluates hydration status, anemia, blood clotting ability, and immune system response. A CBC can also help to establish bleeding disorders or other unseen abnormalities as part of a pre-operative assessment.

So let's take a look at a CBC report and address all of the acronyms. I will keep the explanations as simple as possible.. The photo below is a copy of a typical veterinary CBC report you would receive at your veterinarian's office.

RBC = Red Blood Cell Count Red blood cells, also known as *erythrocytes*, deliver oxygen to the tissues in your body. Oxygen turns into energy and your tissues release carbon dioxide. The red blood cells also transport carbon dioxide to your lungs for you to exhale. Among other things, the RBC can help to determine anemia or a bleeding problem. A low RBC count indicates anemia. Too high of a count (called polycythemia) usually indicates dehydration but can also be a sign of rare blood disease.

HCT = Hematocrit. A hematocrit test measures the proportion of red blood cells in your blood. Having too few or too many red blood cells can be a sign of certain diseases. The hematocrit test, is also known as a packed-cell volume (PCV) test. For those of you over 50 years old, you may recall the mind scaring experience as a little kid of being at the doctor's office and the horror of having your finger pricked to bleed and the nurse sucking up the blood off your finger into a little skinny glass tube. That was an old school hematocrit test.

HGB = Hemoglobin. Hemoglobin is a protein in red blood cells that carries oxygen.. Again, having too low or too high of a count can be a sign of certain diseases. Too low of a hemoglobin number could indicate Aplastic anemia or Cancer. Conditions that can cause a high hemoglobin count include Congenital heart disease, Dehydration, Heart failure., Kidney cancer, Liver cancer.

MCV = Mean Corpuscular Volume. MCV blood test measures the average size of your red blood cells. Think red blood cells and carrying oxygen. **MCH = Mean Corpuscular Hemoglobin.** The MCH represents the average amount of hemoglobin in a cell.

RETIC= Reticulocytes are slightly immature red blood cells. A reticulocyte count measures the amount of these cells in the blood. In the presence of some anemias, the body increases production of red blood cells & sends these cells into the bloodstream before they are mature. Too high of a count could indicate certain diseases like hemolytic anemia.

RDW= Red Cell Distribution Width measures the differences in the volume and size of red blood cells. Normally, red blood cells are all about the same size. A high RDW means that there's a major difference between the size of your smallest and largest red blood cells. Again, this may be a sign of a disease such as anemia or blood loss.

PLT= Platelet Count Test measures the number of platelets in blood. Platelets help form blood clots to slow or stop bleeding and to help wounds heal. Having too many or too few platelets or having platelets that don't work are indicative of disease. A low platelet count is called thrombocytopenia. This affects a dog's blood clotting abilities. This condition can cause a dog to bleed too much due to an injury. Thrombocytopenia is more often hereditary in Greyhounds and Cavalier King Charles Spaniels than other breeds, and small breeds or young-adult dogs are at higher risk. This can be indicative of Immune-mediated Thrombocytopenia (ITP), Cancer, Enlarged spleen or rat poisoning. A higher-than-normal platelet count is called thrombocytosis. It can indicate inflammatory disorders, acute or chronic blood loss, tissue damage, drugs like chemo drugs hyperadrenocorticism, splenectomy, and cancer.

WBC= White Blood Cell Count White blood cells are part of the body's immune system. They help the body fight infection and other diseases. Different types of white blood cells perform different functions in the body. Overall, white blood cells help to protect the body against bacteria, viruses, and parasites. Low white blood cell counts can indicate viral infections, bone marrow abnormalities or overwhelming infections and sepsis. Elevated white blood cell counts indicate infection, inflammation and some forms of cancer or leukemia. High WBC is seen in pyometras.

THE DIFFERENTIAL

A differential is an analysis of the different types of white blood cells. **There are five different types of white blood cells.** The count of these cells can help determine illness/disease.

NEU= Neutrophils. These are the primary white blood cells responsible for fighting infections. High levels of neutrophils indicate infection. Low levels can indicate sepsis. The neutrophils are concentrated in the area of infection or are rapidly being used, leaving less circulating in the blood.

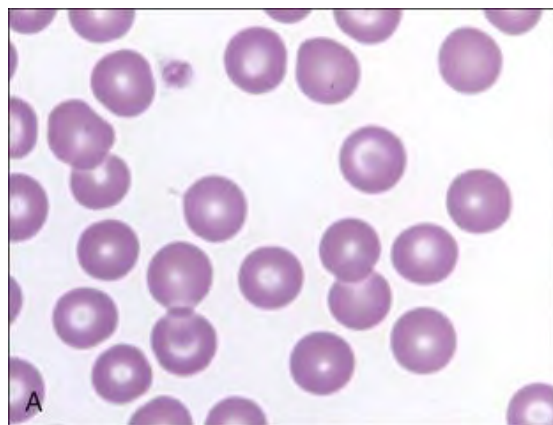
Lymphs= Lymphocytes. These white blood cells play a large role in defending the body against disease and fighting infection. This type of immune cell is made in the bone marrow and is found in the blood and in lymph tissue. The two main types of lymphocytes are B lymphocytes and T lymphocytes. These are the cells that make antibodies to protect possible future infection/viruses. High levels of lymphocytes can indicate infection, viral disease or certain cancers such as lymphosarcoma. Low levels can indicate viral infections affecting the bone marrow or sepsis.

MONO= Monocytes. This white blood cell helps the neutrophils fight infections. High monocyte counts indicate infection. Low or zero monocytes does not indicate any specific disease.

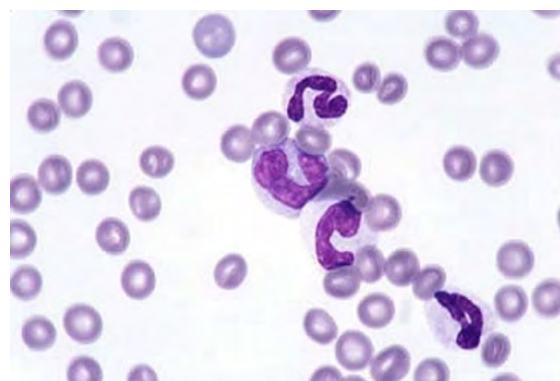
EOS = Eosinophil. This white blood cell is primarily involved in fighting allergies or parasites. If you suffer from allergies your eosinophil count will be elevated. High eosinophil counts indicate an allergy or parasite causing illness. It is possible to have zero eosinophils in normal blood samples.

BASO = Basophils. This white blood cell is the least common type of white blood cell but can be seen in certain parasitic infection, primarily heartworm. High levels indicate possible parasitism. Low levels are not possible since zero basophils are possible in normal blood samples.

Do You Know What You Don't Know?

True or False?

As breeders use inbreeding to improve consistency in their litters, they are also increasing their ability to improve traits through selective breeding.

When people try to make sense of something, they dig out whatever information they have in their head and apply it. If what's in your head is all derived from personal experience, that's the information you use. If what's in your head is from education, you use that together with experience.

Let's take a simple example. If you flip a fair coin, you will get heads half the time and tails half the time. But if you flip a coin 10 times you are unlikely to get 5 heads and 5 tails. We don't see this as a violation of some grand design because we think we understand chance. Yet if you start flipping a coin and get 97 heads in a row, your brain might be screaming at you to predict the next toss will be tails. But if you have had a course in probability or statistics, you

thing we all know (or should) is that there are many things we might think we "know" from limited personal experience that turn out not to be true. The process of science multiplies "experience" many times to provide more reliable information about something. A trained scientist should be keenly aware of the difference between what they think might be true about something based on experience, a hunch, or a few observations (and they might call it a hypothesis), and what is true (or accepted to be true) based on rigorous science. But for the layperson, this difference is not always so obvious. And it's easy to "confirm" what you might want to believe to be true through something called "confirmation bias".

Without the **factual information** about something, we all tend to fall back on experience, logic, opinions, and beliefs, and we are even more convinced that we understand something when it is confirmed by others. But many times we really don't know enough about something to know how likely we are to actually be correct.

“To know that we know what we know, and that we do not know what we do not know, that is true knowledge. “

Henry David Thoreau

will know that even after 97 heads in a row, you are not more likely to get tails than on any other toss.

When I posed the question at the top in the ICB Breeding for the Future Facebook group, I was surprised to see that many people thought the statement was true and just as many thought it was false. Also, many of the explanations used words or phrases like "believe", "think", "this makes sense", "it's logical that...", and so on, and there were also examples from personal experience to support an answer. But the people who chose true and those that chose false can't both be right.

The whole point of science is to figure out how the world works through observation and experimentation, and one

Henry David Thoreau said something that I really like because it's the perspective I bring to the way I think about science:

“To know that we know what we know, and that we do not know what we do not know, that is true knowledge. “

Half of knowledge is knowing the things that are known. But the other half of knowledge is knowing that there is much you don't know, and that you can't even know what those things are. So back to the statement at the top. What's the answer? Is it true or false?

If money is the currency of commerce (because it lets you buy things), then allelic diversity is the currency of selection. You can't change a trait (improve or otherwise) if there is no variation among individuals in the relevant alleles. Inbreeding has the advantage of improving consistency in a litter because it reduces the variation in alleles. But at the same time, there is less variation in the alleles that you need for selection. As inbreeding in a population increases, your ability to change a trait (for better or worse) using selective breeding decreases.

Breeders understand the advantages of inbreeding for consistency, but many fail to see that as their dogs become more and more similar genetically, they are less and less able to change traits through selection. You will hear people say things like "once you lose your fronts, they are hard to get back," or "temperament problems are hard to correct". These are statements about highly polygenic traits; they are influenced by MANY genes, and if the genes for those traits are homozygous in a population, no amount of selective breeding will improve them because you have no variation to select from.

If you understand this concept, you will understand that there is a critical balance you need to achieve in order to have good type in your dogs as well as the ability to improve particular traits. Livestock breeders try to keep inbreeding below 5-10%. Nature tends to keep the level of inbreeding in healthy wildlife populations much lower, usually less than 1%. Most purebred dog breeds have an average level of inbreeding greater than 10%, and many are in the range of 25% and even 50% or more (!!!). You might have good consistency, but it's really hard to produce something much better than what you have with these high levels of inbreeding. Because of this, relentless inbreeding is a dead end.

There's another fact that is handy to know in thinking about this problem. As inbreeding increases, so does something called "**linkage disequilibrium**" (**LD**). Linkage disequilibrium is the tendency for alleles to be inherited in groups instead of independently and randomly. So, you might be trying to eliminate something in your line by selecting against it, but some of the genes you don't want are in a block of genes with one you are selecting for. You can either keep both, or lose both, but selection will not improve one while eliminating the other. Inbreeding increases the size of these blocks of genes that move around together. Populations with higher genetic diversity have lower LD, so they are able to respond faster and with more precision to selection than inbred populations. Yes, there is more variation (less consistency), but the opportunity for genetic gain (improving a trait through selection) is much greater. You can buy exactly what you want if you have lots of money that gives you choice.

The statement at the top is false for two simple reasons. Inbreeding reduces your ability to improve traits because of **a) lower allelic diversity** and **b) higher linkage disequilibrium**.

The people who understood the principles of genetics that the question addresses were able to answer it easily and with a simple statement of that rule. They didn't offer opinions or logic or personal anecdotes (some of which actually "proved" the wrong answer), they didn't wander around in the weeds of ambiguity, or get mired in what

looked like contradictions expressed as "what about this, but what about that?" They relied on a simple principle of genetics to address the question. They probably didn't know this from their personal experience, because it would take breeding many, many litters and good knowledge of other principles of genetics to come to this conclusion. They knew this through education, which also provided the evidence needed for them to understand why it is true.

I keep pounding away at the importance of education. Without it, you have no way to know whether the things you "know" are actually true or false. Many people chose "True" in answer to the question, and they probably think they are correct. If they don't know the science, they will continue to believe that.

Every breeding you do is an (expensive) experiment. If the rules you breed by are actually incorrect, it's going to be hard to produce what you want. And you'll also use what you think you know to come up with reasons why things didn't work as expected. Knowing this little bit of information about the relationship between inbreeding and the allelic diversity needed for selection, you should have a different perspective on the process you use to make breeding decisions. In fact, your perspective will change even more if you know more of the rules.

I posed this question because I was curious to see how people would respond. I really didn't expect to see so many votes for both True AND False, or the number of explanations offered that didn't really support the answer. What is clear is that many people did not know the simple fact that would have made this question easy, and worse - they don't know that they don't know. No doubt, many people are basing breeding decisions on "information" that is simply untrue. How effective and efficient can a breeding program be if it is based on incorrect information?

What would you say to these statements: true or false?

"Hybrid vigor does not occur in dogs."

"I know what's in my lines"

"Breed only the best to the best and spay/neuter the rest."

"Recessive mutations should be removed from the gene pool."

"There is quality in a singleton puppy."

"The dam is more important than the sire."

"Inbreeding does not increase health problems in purebred dogs."

"We have to protect genetic purity of breeds with closed stud books."

You will hear all of these statements in discussions about dog breeding. They are all false because they violate simple principles of genetics that are true whether you believe them or not. How can you breed the best possible dogs if you don't know the rules of the game?

There is no better way to spend some of the time and money you invest in dogs than in your own education. This is why ICB teaches courses. Take them. The COI Bootcamp course is free, and you can take it any time. Take the two courses ICB offers in population genetics. Invest in yourself and become a smarter breeder.

Know the things that are true and know that you don't know what you don't know.
