Nominations for Judges for the CCA Regional & National regular classes and Sweepstakes Judges for 2024 are due by September 30, 2022. Please submit names of judge nominees for the CCA Regional & National shows (including Sweeps Judges)

to: Tracy Potts, Election Chair, 16619 FORT Oswego St, San Antonio, TX 78247-1033. E-mail address: tracypotts1@aol.com. Judges will be voted on at the annual meeting in October

Please be sure that the person you nominate for Sweepstakes is aware of and agrees to the CCA Standing Rules below

1. In October 1986, the Board voted that Sweepstakes judges will NOT exhibit any Chihuahuas at the specialty they are judging or at any companion specialties. (SR7 Apr93) As stated in AKC Rules Applying to Dog Shows, CH II Section 13, this provision does not apply to the judge of the Four-to-Six Month Competition. Such judges may also exhibit on the day(s) they judge. (SR2 NOV16) (Rev 7/20)

2. Each CCA member may nominate one (1) judge in CCA's specialty judge selection process. The top six (6) nominated judges will be listed on the ballot, and members may vote for one (1) judge.

3. The membership of the Chihuahua Club of America will nominate one Sweepstakes judge for the Fall National/Regional Specialties at least one (1) year in advance of the specialties. The nominee must indicate his/her written acceptance of the assignment before the nomination is submitted. Nominations will be made in the same manner as nominations for Specialty judges, with the top six (6) listed on the ballot and members vote for one (1) judge. The CCA will continue to honor our members by selecting them to be our Sweepstakes judges whenever possible. (SR3 Oct92) (SR15 May96)

(SR2 June03) (rev. SR1 Nov06) (rev 11/19) (Rev 7/20)

4. No previous CCA Specialty conformation judge may be asked to judge within five (5) years of his/her past assignment except in the case of an entry overload. (SR2 Oct93) (SR20Oct96)

5. CCA members will select the Club's specialties' conformation and sweepstakes judges at the membership meeting at the Fall Regional/National show conducted in conjunction with the annual election. (SR10 May96) (SR June03) (revNov09) (revOct14)(rev 11/19) (Rev 07/20)

Choosing a Stud Dog

Decisions, Decisions

Whether you line breed, inbreed, outcross or use a combination of breeding approaches, choosing a stud dog can have a significant impact on the breed because of the number of bitches that it is possible for him to breed and puppies he can produce. There is no single stud dog that's perfect for every bitch, so before you can even consider choosing the right one for your bitch there is a decent amount of homework to do. Choosing the right stud dog takes time. You'll need months to do the right research and talk to the right people who can help you make the best decision. As a rule of thumb, start planning for a breeding during the heat prior to the one in which you plan to breed.

Evaluate Your Bitch

Using the breed standard, you should have a picture of the ideal Dachshund in your mind. Without it, it is like trying to assemble pieces of a puzzle. If you have no idea of what the completed puzzle should look like, it is next to impossible to piece it together. It's important to take an honest look at the bitch you plan to breed. Absolute 'musts' are that she be healthy including appropriate tests/screenings, have an ideal Dachshund temperament and that she be of breeding quality. Using the Dachshund breed standard as your guide make written notes of her assets as well as her faults, especially the most important

one or two faults you would like to improve by breeding her. This is a great time to reach out to a mentor to help you look objectively at your bitch. If her faults are disqualifying or serious ones, or if her faults outweigh her assets, ask yourself if breeding her is the right thing to do for your breeding program.

Since your bitch is the product of the dogs in her pedigree, do the same assessment of the dogs behind her going back at least three generations. Reach out to the breeders/owners of dogs you don't know to learn something about their assets and faults just as you did for your bitch. If you gather information on littermates, even better. The goal is to understand traits (good and bad) that may find their way into your upcoming breeding. It's also important to understand how her faults are passed genetically from one generation to the next. For example, trying to improve a front (a recessive trait) on a bitch with good fronts behind her might be possible to improve on some but not all her

puppies in a generation or two by breeding her to a dog who has an exceptional front himself. But breeding her to a dog with a bad front and with no good fronts behind him will never produce a good front.

Create a List of Candidates

Depending on your preferred breeding approach, start a list of possible candidates. Start with photos which can give you some initial impressions. Of course, the best way to gather information on dogs and bloodlines is by putting your hands on dogs still living. For most of us, this is best accomplished at

specialties - especially the National Specialty. You may have a chance to see the dogs themselves in the Specials or Veterans classes, and you can often get to see what these dogs are producing. If your goal is to produce a top-quality male; you should pay particular attention to the males that the stud dogs are producing and what the males are like behind the dog. Look at his daughters, dam, grand dams, etc. for producing a top female.

The chances of finding a stud dog that compliments every one of your bitch's faults is unlikely, but you should definitely rule out dogs that share too many of her faults or pass those faults onto their offspring-this is especially important when it comes to your bitch's more serious faults. Ideally one of his outstanding assets is something he passes on when bred to other bitches, and that asset offsets one of the faults you would like to correct in your bitch. If he's just 'average', it's unlikely he will pass along anything outstanding to your bitch. Don't forget to assess each dog's temperament - it's as important to a well-bred Dachshund as any individual part of its anatomy. If you can't meet the stud in person, ask people that know him or have bred bitches to him what they think. Just as you did with your bitch and her ancestors, make a list of all the assets and faults of the stud dogs you are considering along with their ancestors. Again, use mentors, breeders of the stud dogs and their ancestors as well as the breeders/owners of their offspring to accomplish this.

Your Goal is to Learn:

- **What assets/faults he puts on his offspring?**
- **Does he throw himself, better than himself or worse?**
- **Does he produce better with some bitches and not others? (If yes, look at the pedigrees to see if the good ones are comparable to yours)**
- **Are there offspring to look at? (If none are available, look at the stud dog's parents, grandparents, siblings and the siblings' offspring)**
- **Is the stud dog like his relatives, or is he unique? (In general, traits that are similar across relatives are more likely to appear in his offspring than traits that are unique)**

Narrow your research down on each stud dog to their three best assets and the three worst faults. Assess each dog and decide if you can tolerate their faults if their strengths are what your bitch needs. Eliminate any dogs that don't pass this review. Then look at the remaining dogs to see which dog's top assets align with some of your bitch's assets and offsets your bitch's worst fault. For example, if your bitch has a soft topline, look for stud dogs with strong toplines and whose offspring have the same. You still need to look at the stud dog overall and what makes for a good Dachshund, i.e. don't choose the dog with a strong topline who lacks and produces narrow ribs. An important fault in your bitch won't be corrected by a stud dog overdone in the same area. You'll likely get puppies with both traits, not a happy medium. Your best choice is the dog that's better than your

bitch in her most important faults and is most correct and balanced overall.

Talking With Stud Dog Owners

The stud dog owner is your most valuable resource in your search. Open, honest discussion is especially important. Explain that you have plans to breed your bitch and would like to learn more about their dog and if he could be considered as an option for you.

Be sure to share everything about your bitch; her assets, faults, temperament, health/screenings, etc. Ask the owner to tell you about the same about the stud dog along with any traits he may be dominant for. Ask if the stud dog owner has kept any puppies from the stud. If not, why not?

The stud dog owners should want to see your bitch before agreeing to breed. Ideally, they should see her in person if possible, or on video, at least. Should any of the owners on your list decline to breed to your bitch, don't take it personally. Some owners may prefer to prove a young dog first with a bitch of their own to understand their capabilities. Owners with proven dogs may know which bloodlines go well with their dog or based on prior breedings and might advise you against a breeding to avoid doubling up on faults. Remember no stud dog is the right dog for every bitch.

Don't let personality conflicts with stud dog owners influence you if you can help it. If the stud is a good choice for your bitch, but you don't 'click' with the owner, do it anyway. Don't let personal feelings stand between you and a great litter. Both you and the stud owner should try to put personal feelings aside when deciding if the bitch can produce puppies you can both be proud of. By the same standard, stud owners or bitch owners should never breed to each other's dog simply because they like each other. The preservation of the breed should be the focus of every breeding.

Make Your Choice

Once you've chosen the perfect stud for your bitch, you should choose a back-up. You already have your asset and fault list, so this shouldn't be too hard. Contact the second chosen stud owner and see if they would mind acting as a reserve in case the first stud is unavailable at the time you need him. The first stud dog may be out of town showing, he may have a prior breeding commitment for the same time (someone else beat you to him), his sperm may not hold up for shipping, he may be ill, etc. A knowledgeable stud owner should not be offended by being chosen for second place and know all of the things that can happen between now and then with the first-choice stud. They should understand your decision and respect your honesty. Keep the second stud owner informed on the progress of your bitch when the time to breed gets close - just in case!

I'm so grateful with the opportunity of getting to know so many of our amazing members and other Chihuahua fanciers from all over the world. Francesco's background and experience combine a global view of our Sport as a well-known and respected judge, preservation breeder, and exhibitor, who has achieved great results and has taken our breed to an international wide spotlight and deserving evidence. It's my pleasure to share this interview with you:

Mr. Francesco Cochetti.

INTERNATIONAL

How did you become involved with dogs?

I was born in a dog family. My parents were breeding Poodles under the affix "Della Perla Grigia" and my father was a judge too. I got my own prefix by the Italian Kennel Club "Di San Gimignano" in year 1984 and in year 1992 I became judge.

What breeds do you have and how did you choose your first breed?

Nowadays I breed Toy Poodles and Chihuahuas and we have at home also an old Jack Russell Terrier (we have bred Jack too) and two English Pointers who belong to my daughter Sara. I didn't choose my first breed, it came in my life in a natural way.

Where does your dog interest lie and Why?

As I said I got it from my parents and I think I had the love for the dogs in my genes, because my sisters, even if they both love dogs, were not interested in breeding or judging and not too much in showing too.

Do you actively exhibit and or breed your dogs?

I consider myself, first of all, a breeder, then I'm a judge. I'm not exhibiting my dogs so much; I use handlers or my daughter is showing our dogs. I'm judging a lot and of course this part I miss a lot. When I can, I like to show myself my dogs, but this doesn't happen often.

Has COVID 19 resulted in any changes to your dog-related pursuits?

Yes, the pandemic changed our way to live and it impacted on many aspects. A lot of difficulties for traveling because of many restrictions, many shows are cancelled and of course the dogs also had not the best socialization during this time.

What do you enjoy most about our Sport?

I love to be in contact with dogs and people. Dog world is like a big family, and it is a hobby that gives you the possibility to travel



a lot and to know different cultures. A dog person will always find someone who has his common passion whenever he will go.

What is the hardest part of the standard to breed for consistently?

Unfortunately, the type of the Chihuahua is not homogeneous. We have lost many important features of the breed, like, for example, big eyes and big ears, which give the good expression of the breed. I think, as a breeder, the most difficult thing to breed is the soundness. A sound construction means to get a dog in balance between front and rear angulations, with a correct topline and tailset. Much more difficult to breed an excellent construction than an excellent head.

What do you see as trending in the breed today - good and bad?

It is in general in all breeds. It seems that people are much more focused on showmanship instead of type. Chihuahua should have reach and drive, and not a short movement. There are many specimens with poor movement because of bad fronts or too straight fronts, it depends in which continent we are watching them. It was a popular breed some years ago and this had a negative impact on the breed because they were so many who were interested only in getting money. In the other hand there are several good breeders, even young, who are coming up and I hope the situation will change in the coming years.

Have you sold Chihuahuas into other countries and how did you find that in?

We have exported our dogs worldwide, in all continents. We prefer to sell abroad than in Italy or in Finland, where my wife came. We had a lot of satisfactions and over 600 champions abroad, including World and European winners, BIS winners and many winners have our dogs in their background.

What has been the most significant change in our sport since you got your first dog? Knowing what you know now, would you do this all over again?

In the past, the dog world was a niche of tick people, and the atmosphere was nicer than before. But there are still many positive things

How do you spend your non-dog time?

I have my family, my friends and my job as a business consultant. I have also many other interests in my life, even if the dogs have taken a big part of it.

When it comes to dogs and/or your personal life what one thing is still on your bucket list?

There are many things in my bucket list. I'm a dreamer and dreams give me the possibility to get my numerous goals.



What can you tell us about yourself that we wouldn't already know?

I'm what I'm!

UNDERSTANDING YOUR DOG'S BLOODWORK

Understanding Your Dog' Bloodwork Part II Chemistry Panel

I hope you were able to get some good information from the first part of this series in the last issue of the Chi Chatter about CBC/Complete Blood Count. Continuing on now to Chemistry Panels. Again, do you know what all those acronyms on your report stand for and what exactly does it tell the vet? And again, your own bloodwork report will look remarkably like your dog's report.

The blood chemistry panel is a vital tool for the diagnosis of diseases and disorders. It is an essential part of a thorough evaluation so a blood chemistry panel is a standard of practice.

What Does It All Mean and What Are All Those Acronyms?

Without getting too scientific or complicated, every test on a chemistry panel is gaged to determine organ/system function, either an excess or diminished amount of protein, acid, or enzyme produced by the organ/system. The amounts determined in the blood help the doctors in their diagnosis of the patient or give the doctor a heads up about trouble that is brewing. *(Disclaimer/Note: some of these tests are used to test multiple organ function, but for the purpose of this teaching article, I am keeping it simple)*

Liver Function Assessment Hepatic Function Panel

Alanine Aminotransferase (ALT/SGPT); Albumin (ALB), Alkaline Phosphatase (ALKP), Aspartate Aminotransferase (AST/SGOT) Bilirubin, Total Protein (TP)

Albumin is a small protein produced by the liver. Albumin acts as a sponge to hold water in the blood vessels. When blood albumin is decreased, the pressure created by the heart pumping blood through the blood vessels causes fluid to leak out of the vessels and accumulate in body cavities or tissues as edema (Fluid swelling). Albumin is decreased if the liver is damaged or if albumin is lost through damaged intestine or in the urine due to kidney disease. Dehydration is the cause of increased albumin.

Alkaline phosphatase originates from many tissues in the body. An increase in alkaline phosphatase is indicative of liver disease, bone disease, Cushing's disease, or increased blood cortisol from certain drugs.

ALT is an enzyme produced by liver cells. Increased levels of ALT in the blood are consistent with liver damage.

Amylase is an enzyme produced by the pancreas and intestinal tract that help the body break down sugars. Increased Amylase is seen in dogs with pancreatitis, something Chihuahuas and other toy breeds are notorious for having.

Chemistry Quick Reference

Bile acids are produced by the liver and are involved in fat breakdown. A bile acid test will evaluate the function of the liver including the blood flow to the liver. Abnormal levels of bile acids can indicate a liver shunt.

Bilirubin is produced by the liver as a product of old red blood cells. Bilirubin is eliminated in both the urine and stool. Bilirubin is increased in the blood in patients with some types of liver disease, gallbladder disease, or when red blood cells are being destroyed at a faster than normal rate. Large amounts of bilirubin in the bloodstream will give a yellow color to the skin, eyes, gums, and other mucus membranes.

Total Protein is exactly what it sounds like; the total amount of proteins in the blood. Changes in total protein have different implications including liver disease depending on which component is altered.

Kidney/Renal Function

BUN (blood urea nitrogen), Creatinine ratio; Calcium, Phosphorus, Potassium, Sodium

BUN (blood urea nitrogen) is a byproduct of normal protein metabolism, and the kidneys are responsible for filtering it from the blood. Reasons it may be elevated include improperly functioning kidneys, dehydration, heart disease and urinary obstruction.

Creatinine is a waste byproduct of normal muscle metabolism and is filtered by the kidneys. It can be elevated for the same reasons as BUN but is less affected by dehydration, so it is a more reliable indicator of decreased kidney function.

Phosphorus The kidneys maintain phosphorus at an optimal level,. An increase may indicate the kidneys are not functioning properly.

Calcium can be elevated for a number of reasons including kidney disease, certain types of cancer, some types of poison, and metabolic disturbances. Calcium and phosphorus relative values can be informative, particularly in the case of metabolic disorders.

As breeders we know that low blood calcium may occur in dogs before labor and while they are nursing. This is called eclampsia and is more common toybreed dogs. Eclampsia causes tetany (rigid muscles) Anti-freeze poisoning may show low calcium.

Sodium (Na), Potassium (K), and Chloride (Cl) are collectively known as electrolytes. Na is increased in the case of dehydration. It is decreased with vomiting or diarrhea, kidney disease and some metabolic diseases. Decreased K occurs in the presence of vomiting or diarrhea.

Glucose, Amylase, Lipase, T3/T4

Glucose is the sugar that powers the muscles and brain, and can change rapidly. Elevated blood glucose can indicate diabetes or stress decreased glucose (hypoglycemia) can be due to liver, kidney or metabolic disorders.

Amylase and Lipase are enzymes produced by the pancreas to aid in digestion. Elevated numbers are seen when the pancreas is damaged. Other conditions include kidney disease, drugs, and gastrointestinal disease.

T3/T4 tests measures thyroid function. Increases and decreases both indicate thyroid disease

Of course, this list by no means includes all of the testing available in a chemistry panel, but these are the main ones you will see on the majority of reports.



Institute of Canine Biology On Preserving the Purebred Dog

In 2015, the UK Kennel Club published a basic genetic analysis of pedigree breeds based on the data in their stud books. This analysis showed that, for many breeds, there were high levels of inbreeding and low effective population sizes. Subsequently, to address concerns that some of their native breeds might be at risk of extinction because of declining numbers, they created a listing of breeds that were vulnerable or at risk. They have subsequently monitored registrations of these breeds and annually update the statistics online.

Although AKC would have the records for yearly registrations, they don't make those statistics available. Unless breeders or breed clubs compile these records themselves, there is no way to track breed population sizes in the US. Based on pedigree records of a few breeds that I happen to have, however, there is good reason to be concerned.

I have pedigree databases for a number of breeds that were compiled by breeders and provided to me for genetic analysis. These include the Irish Wolfhound, Afghan Hound, Belgian Tervuren, Rhodesian Ridgeback, and Portuguese Water Dog. I have compiled the information for number of dogs born per year as reflected in the pedigree database, and in some cases I have also recorded the number of litters recorded per year.

For the odd assortment of breeds I have data for, there is a consistent and very disturbing trend. Since about 2000, registrations are crashing. (Note that the decline in Afghans dates to the 1970s but since about 2000, registrations are dropping even more rapidly.)

These are not slow declines; they are crashes. And if you extrapolate the lines, the trajectories of these breeds will hit zero in just a few years - less than a decade for some. I'm sure there are breeds with steady or even increasing registrations, but we don't have the data to know. In the UK, registrations of many breeds are also dropping, but at the same time the numbers of Pugs and French Bulldogs are going stratospheric. Perhaps that is the case in the US as well.

Population crashes have consequences. Genetic diversity is lost, and the rate of inbreeding necessarily goes up as effective and census population sizes go down. We can expect the incidence and number of genetic disorders to increase. Health will decline

and interventions by breeders will become increasingly ineffective. It's not a good situation.

What are we doing about this? Nothing. If AKC is monitoring breed populations, they are not making that information available. Unlike kennel clubs elsewhere in the world that have geneticists on staff to provide guidance to breeders about genetic management, or organizations like the Animal Health Trust with expertise and research capabilities that are available to breeders, in the US it's every breeder for themselves. Breed clubs and their health committees make decisions about breeding strategies in the absence of relevant expertise, and more often than not the general strategy is to remove dogs from the breeding population that are afflicted with disorders for which there are no tests (e.g., epilepsy, cancer, immune system disorders, etc).

I am not aware of any plans to address these problems, by the kennel club, breed clubs, or smaller groups of breeders. In fact, breeders might not even be generally aware of their dire situation. For the breeds with data below, time for action has nearly run out.


I have argued before that dogs have high value as a genetic resource. Dogs shaped the development of civilization. In many places in the world they are still essential for the special abilities

they have for management of livestock, not to mention their roles as service animals, detection of everything from invasive plants to cancer, military and police service, and companions that improve our own health and longevity while they enrich our lives.


There is plenty of evidence that purebred dogs are not doing well. And we also know that in many cases we are not doing what we can (as for the Doberman). Breeds are about to disappear. Are we going to just let this happen?

Irish Wolfhound


Number of Dogs





Number of Litters




Rhodesian Ridgeback - Number of Dogs

Bad Dog Agility

Bad Dog Agility is an on-line agility training site. They are perhaps best known for their Agility Power Ranking Scores which are posted quarterly and annually. They have been doing this since 2000.

The top 10 dogs of each breed are posted in their Breed Power 10 standings. Only dogs competing at the Masters level who have earned a qualifying score in both Jumpers with Weaves and Standard are included in the rankings. Each dog is given a “power score” which is simply their Jumpers with Weaves average yards per second and two times their Standard course average yards per second. This formula is used to better reflect the structure of the AKC National Agility Championships where performance on the standard course is weighted more heavily. The rankings first included Chihuahuas in 2001, there were 2, and in 2002, there were 3. In 2003 there were 9 and by 2007 there were 10 Chihuahuas!

In 2008, the Breed Power 10 began including Chihuahuas jumping 4” inches with just 3 Chihuahuas in that category that year. By 2012 there were 10 Chihuahuas listed for both the 8” and 4” jump height.

In 2013, the fastest ever Chihuahua power score was 13.43 yards by a Chihuahua named Squish who averaged 5.20 yards per second in Jumpers with Weaves and 4.11 yards per second in standard.

In 2015, the first Chihuahua bred by Rossmoyne's Chihuahuas to make the Breed 10 rankings was Sarah's Chipper Chico owned by Sarah Landis ranking 8th in the 4" standings. In each subsequent year there have been 2, 3, 4, and even 5 Chihuahuas bred by Rossmoyne Chihuahuas in the Breed Power 10 Rankings. The first Chihuahua to appear in the 8" division was Gonzo the Great owned by Brenda Landis who was ranked #6 in 2018. Rossmoyne's Little Red Zoot owned by Brenda Landis was the #1 ranked 8" Chihuahua in 2019, 2020, and 2021. In 2019 Zoot's Power Score was 13.37 with his average yards per second being 5.17 for jumpers and 4.10 for standard. Zoot is still competing and I have hopes that one day he may break Squish's record power score.

Rossmoyne's Toot Toot Tootsie owned by Gale Wise and Rossmoyne's Rizzo the Renowned owned by Brenda Landis have both appeared in the Breed Power 10 Rankings for 4" Chihuahua five times since 2016. Rossmoyne's She's a Spicy Girl owned by Gale Wise has appeared twice.

Will Your Dogs Need to Be Rescued?

I love the Chihuahua breed. That is why I got into Rescue. It began by helping an old breeder who was in the beginning stages of dementia. She asked for help placing her dogs because she was unable to keep track of which ones she had fed and exercised. This effort led to the formation of a Chihuahua Rescue group, coordinated via the beginnings of the internet. We organized, incorporated, received a 501c3, and did all the things a rescue does.

Rescue is about saving, in this case, dogs that are in danger of harm or death. Most stories are about hoarders and other extreme situations. We help with that, but usually our cases start with "my mother died, and we can't keep her Chihuahuas" or something similar. Other cases involve a Chihuahua found on the street without a chip or other identification. The finder is looking for help in order to avoid taking the animal to the pound or a shelter. As space in foster homes allows, we can help. In the case of the family or friend who has died or moved into another living situation, solutions could be developed by the dog's owners. Planning for the future of our pets without us is not fun but is part of our responsibility as a pet owner.

Most of us have thought about providing for our dogs if they should survive us. How many of us have added our dogs to our wills? But have we considered that the will may not be dealt with right after our death? The dogs could starve to death waiting for probate. Here are things we can do to make sure that our dogs are cared for when we die, or if we are suddenly unable to care for ourselves and them.

GENERAL PLANNING

Here is the beginning of a list that you can use as a starting point in planning for the future and the welfare of your pets: Set up a written plan with a friend or family member and designate who is to execute it.

- Create a file for each animal with photos, vet records, microchip numbers, and all other pertinent information.
- Make a list of the animals for your designee. Be sure your designee knows where the files are to be kept.
- Specify where each animal is to go, include means to identify each dog, and include contact information for everyone concerned. Include your vet's information.
- Make sure your designee has a copy of the plan, and that your executor and attorney have one too.
- Be sure someone has a key to your home, and that others know how to reach that person.
- Post this information in a prominent place in your home and carry it with you. For example: "In case of emergency, call _____ at (000) 000-0000".
- Contact your attorney to be sure your will is in order, and that it is appropriate for your state.

TRAVEL EMERGENCIES

Do you travel with your dogs? All of us in the dog show world have heard about exhibitors being involved in an accident on the way to or from the show. In the cases where the people are taken to the hospital, what happens to the dogs? In most cases, if there is no owner able to take care of them at the time, they will be taken to a shelter or impound facility. How this is managed depends on where the incident happens, and what facilities are available. Therefore, you need an individual identification on each animal, which should include a microchip, and some sort of easily readable tag or collar or crate tag. Make sure your microchip registration information is up to date.

The microchip needs to have a second phone number in its registration – someone who doesn't travel with you. That way, someone can be contacted to take care of retrieving the animals until you are again able to care for them.

If the pickup will take time, have someone authorized to pay for short term boarding in a local veterinary clinic.

Make sure your vet can be contacted to verify vaccinations, so that the dogs can be sent to a local veterinarian or shelter for temporary safekeeping. One way to provide this information to first responders could be by having an information/emergency information card on each crate, with

If you can manage it, set up a specific, dedicated account with emergency funds for your dogs. Have your trusted designee as a signer on the debit card, so the vet or other caregiver can be paid for the animals' expenses until such time as they can be retrieved.

Do you travel without your dogs? Whether you leave them with a family member, a pet sitter, or at a boarding kennel, you do need to make sure that those people know something has happened and are prepared to deal with it on your behalf. This includes your local errand trips. Be sure you have an ICE number in your phone. That is whoever should be notified if something happens to you. It means In Case of Emergency. Be sure the ICE contact person is aware of the information in the section above.

If you are away from home during the day, you might want to have a card in your wallet that says something like:

My pets are home alone.

In case of emergency, please contact

_____ at

(000) 000-0000.

This person has access to my house.

You love your dogs. You want what is best for them. Plan for it.

OTHER EMERGENCIES

Speaking of planning for your dogs, what plans do you have for environmental emergencies such as weather, fires, earthquakes, floods, and an accident near you involving a tanker or container with poisonous liquids or gases?

I got to thinking about that sort of thing and realized that we didn't have a way to evacuate our dogs in one trip if something happened. I bought a vehicle that could carry all of them, if I

also got smaller crates. I set up a plan for how to pack them in, along with a "go bag" for them and for the humans. I have fewer dogs now, but the plan has just been modified a little in order to pack them in a little differently.

The "go bag" is actually a "go box" with a sealable lid. It contains copies of the dogs' records, food for them for a few days, bottles of water, something to use for bedding, and any medicines needed. I update it every so often. Actually, every time I order dog food is a time to refresh the food in it. Oh, and I also include all the "in case of emergency information", for contacting people who can help if needed.

Rescue groups are always stretched to the limit. If more people could develop viable plans for the care of their pets in emergency situations, the animals would be less stressed, and rescue would not have to become involved.
