



#### TREASURER'S REPORT

January 3, 2023-The balance in the CCA checking account is \$90,441.60. This amount includes \$26,106.71 for the Health Fund. I will have a better breakdown for the other funds (Juniors, Rescue, and Trophy) as soon as I get a chance to enter all of the deposits from November & December into the system. My last two months have been consumed with collecting payments from the Nationals, collecting Chi Chatter ad payments, collecting member & member club dues, and sending out multiple rounds of dues reminders via snail mail & email. One of our members suggested that we might move our dues deadline to another month, one that was not as busy as December. Many of our members find it convenient to pay their dues at the Nationals in October, as I bring the forms with me to the shows. The forms are available on the CCA website. They are published near the end of the year in the Chi Chatter. And you can always contact me for copies of the renewal forms and Code of Ethics forms. For the last two years, I have sent out the forms at the beginning of December, and I remind everyone again near the end of December. Our dues deadlines – December 31st for the normal amount, January 31st for an additional \$5.00, and February 28th for an additional \$10.00 – have been set that way for a number of years. I've tried to make things as easy as possible for our members and member clubs to get their dues in on time, thereby avoiding the additional fees for late payment. And, considering how time-consuming dues collections are for me in November and December, I would absolutely be open to any members who choose to send their dues in as early as September. It would certainly make my life easier.

If you make payments to CCA online, and the payments are coming from an account with another name, please remember to place the member's name in the comments section. It makes my life easier if I don't have to scroll through all of the email addresses on our membership roster, trying to pin down which member is making a payment. Also please remember that the CCA PayPal email address is chiclubofamerica@gmail.com. I generally include my email address in all correspondence, but only as a way to contact me. Please do not use my email address to make PayPal payments to CCA.

Thanks to all of our members and member clubs who have already renewed their membership. I think we have close to 80% of our members who have met the December 31st deadline.

#### MINUTES OF CCA BOARD MEETING

DECEMBER 7, 2022

President Lynnie Bunten called the meeting to order at 7:36 CST.

Present: Lynnie Bunten, Racheal Miller, Emily Buller, Kara Gordon, Sherrie Shirky, Bill Block, Annette Waldkoetter, Michelle Brislin, Christie Foulk. Absent Beverly La Fleur.

Also, present Barbara Proctor – Parliamentarian.

Minutes approved as read for November 9 Board meeting.

Minutes of October 15 Annual meeting approved by Board with no corrections

Minutes of August 11 Board meeting approved with no corrections

Secretary Report: Christie has received a member complaint along with a \$50.00 check. Copies of the complaint were mailed to all Board members on Nov. 21 2022. Updated Standing Committees and new Committee Chairs have been sent to Michelle Brislin for the website.

**Treasurer report:** Treasurer Sherrie Shirky has mailed renewal forms with the code of ethics form to all members who have not yet renewed. Emails have gone out to foreign members. Sherry says we must have a signed COE on file. CCA Member Club renewal forms were mailed to the contact person on file for each member club not yet renewed.

For those members who renew online, the member renewal forms, and COE can either be mailed or emailed to Sherrie Shirky, CCA Treasurer.

The balance in the CCA checkbook is \$84,102.00—comprised of \$26,036.71 for the Health Fund, and \$58,065.29 for the General Fund.

The Board ratified previous email votes to seat Christie Foulk as CCA Secretary, and to seat Racheal Miller in Christie's vacated Director seat.

The Board ratified previous email votes to seat new committee chairs, as well as reseating the standing committees.

The Board ratified the previous email vote to amend the standing rule concerning approval for member club specialties. This standing rule has been changed to: No two Member clubs located less than 500 miles apart can hold their specialty shows on the same dates or overlapping set of dates without approval from CCA.

Michelle Brislin's motion, seconded by Racheal Miller, that the Board add a standing Rule requiring that individual members or families must only renew their own -personal family member renewals, due to the concern that allowing others to submit renewals could create a liability for the club. The Board approved the motion.

The standing rules are in the process of being updated.

The following new members were approved:

Mike Wolfe, Clayton and Sharon Mooney, Susan Gartner, Barbara Chamberlain, Susan Mc Neely, Annalisa Waldkoetter, Betty Pollock, Laura Strucky, Kacie Davis, and Halley Garret. A new junior member, Bryant Janetzke has been approved.

The Board called for an adjournment with a fixed date of December 14 at 7 CST to reconvene.

On December 14 at 7:15 CST The CCA Board reconvened to set the date and time of a hearing in regard to a member complaint.

Meeting adjourned at 9:40 CST.

#### TEACHING THE WEAVES

I once read that the only part of agility which is totally unnatural for dogs is weaving. It takes a great deal of patience and practice to teach a dog to weave. There are many different methods and approaches to teaching weaves.

I think that weaves are the most difficult obstacle on any course for most agility dogs - including Chihuahuas. Weaves require a great deal of concentration, and the slightest distraction can result in a weave fault.

It is very easy for your Chihuahua to miss the weave entry especially if he is going fast or coming at it from a difficult angle. Another very common weave fault is popping out early- often at the 10th pole.

Weaves are so difficult that AKC novice courses contain only six weave poles instead of twelve and each team is given three attempts to complete the six weave poles without being faulted. Moving from novice to open is difficult because in open there are twelve weave poles and only one attempt to complete them correctly is permitted without accruing faults.







Some of the various methods for teaching and learning weaves include weave-o-matics, 2x2s, channel weaves, using guides - for Chihuahuas x-pens work well. Some people start by luring using peanut butter or cheese on a long stick or wooden spoon. I think most people end up using a combination of different methods until they find out what works best with their Chihuahua.

Each dog will be different, but what is certain is that it takes weeks or even months of daily practice to master the weaves. Weaves are not something that your Chihuahua will learn if they only do them once week. Some successful agility dogs never totally master independent weaves, and you will see many handlers assisting their dogs through the weaves. There are some games classes where weaves are optional, and these were always my favorite as I never successfully trained any of my Chihuahuas perfectly for weaving.

Back when I personally was competing in agility my Chihuahuas would only weave with me on their left. I didn't compete long enough or practice hard enough to master offside weaves.

If you want to compete properly you will need to train your Chihuahua to weave with you either on the left or the right, and it would probably be best to alternate sides right from the beginning.

My friend Brenda Landis has her Chihuahuas are trained to weave independently, quickly, and efficiently with her on either side. Here are some pictures of her and her Chihuahuas and some various training methods she uses.



Whichever method, or combination of methods, you use keep in mind agility is supposed to be fun! Be patient, be kind and encouraging. These little dogs thrive on affection and praise. If you are having fun, so will they. And visa-versa, so keep it light. Some will learn quickly; some may take some time. Multiple, short, practice sessions are very effective.

#### Front Well Under the Dog

Over the years I have known our breed I have found this aspect of the Chihuahua Standard one that many do not understand. I have heard many say, "Just look at the front." When I look at this front, I see two straight legs that are anything but set on well under the dog. Not only is this phrase very misunderstood; it is my opinion it is probably one of the most difficult aspects of the Chihuahua to breed for and to maintain.

When I used to teach the seminar for judges at our national, I usually suggested to my audience that they take an index finger and physically trace the outline of a dog they are examining. I will never forget having a judge of our breed come up to me after this presentation and say, "I never understood this phase until you described/defined it today." When one traces the outline of a correct Chihuahua Front, it can be quite an "eye opener". Starting on the throat of the dog and tracing down toward the front legs one should find a significant amount of chest before the front legs are found. Tracing the outline of the dog with the index finger should take one "under the dog" before front legs interfere with this tracing exercise. A properly placed front assembly is a critical part of a pleasing side picture of our breed.

If one places his/her hand on the withers of a Chihuahua or any dog that should have a front well under itself, this person should then find point of shoulder. From point of shoulder to elbow should also be evaluated. The distance from withers to point of shoulder and point of shoulder to elbow should be as close to equal as possible. When the front is not well under the dog, a shorter distance is found from point of should elbow than point of shoulder to withers. This finding makes for what is most often called a straight front.

# The Judge's Verdict – Dick's Thoughts

Mr. Richard Miller, AKC Judge - CCA Life Member

Persons that use this term correctly are referring to the angle created by the shoulder blade and the upper arm of the dog. A dog with a straight front when its standard calls for a front well under the dog has a serious fault even though the standard does not address this as a serious fault.

This straight front is unable to reach like it should. This reduced reach in front coupled with an angulated rear often causes the dog to side wind as it moves. The angulated rear can drive so well that the front gets in the way of proper movement. The dog has no choice but to place its rear feet to one side or the other of the interfering front legs. This is especially true of a dog that is not overly long in body. A longer bodied dog can have a very faulty front and move true down and back. We have all seen dogs that do lots of stepping, but they are not getting very far. This kind of movement is anything, but what we want to see.

A Chihuahua should be swift moving; however, this swift movement is a reaching front coupled with a driving rear that carries the dog swiftly around the show ring. This can only happen when the well angulated front (a front well under the dog) is matched with a well angulated rear assembly.

Breeders have to concentrate on breeding the total animal. This is a huge challenge given there are so many aspects of the Chihuahua (or any breed) that make a specific breed unique. When I was actively breeding, I never bred for extreme heads. I liked a pretty head, but I found it very difficult to compromise on a good front assembly.

Many times, when I was showing in group competition I would like to get toward the front of the line. Too often another exhibitor felt my Chihuahua could not move out well enough to be near the front of the line. Many times, I found it necessary to say, "I'll trade places with you after we move if my dog cannot keep up in line."

#### REDUCING STILLBORN PUPS AND C-SECTIONS

I have been making some progress with help from cooperative breeders doing what I have been calling "dark whelping" (coined by me, so it's not already a thing). Shortly thereafter, people started posting about "what they do" that they think reduces mortality and CS, and it was clear my post would turn into a depository of crowd-sourced anecdotes and opinions.

This is not a good thing. There are plenty of people with opinions but no actual knowledge. Swimming in a sea of this stuff, breeders will make the mistake of adopting opinions and anecdotes as facts. It happens all the time, and as this "information" gets spread around, it becomes more and more "true", facebook groups are formed that dispense advice, and all sorts of stuff becomes "fact".

For a great example of this: There is an entire industry now built on the "fact" that the correct diet for dogs is raw meat. Yet, there is no actual, scientific information that supports this, and in fact most dogs have a digestive physiology that handles grains as well as we do. In fact, the scientific term for this "raw" stuff is ideology, or as I would call it, "hooey". And yet, I suspect my mere mention of this will set some fingers typing comments telling me I'm wrong. (I'll turn off comments to prevent this.) No data, no evidence, just argument. That's how you spot ideology.

My point here is that I've been working on this for a year. There is no information about it in dogs. I have looked hard and I seem to be the only person worldwide to be poking around in this topic.

Notice that I have provided very little information about this; basically I have described some general observations. Yet, already there are "experts" telling others what they "know" about it. So, for the little that I know sbout it, I am uncomfortable as the "world expert" Now, please read this. Carefully.

Resist the urge to listen to people that claim to know anything about it, because they have no data. It doesn't exist. And be especially careful about hearing something and thinking to yourself that it must be true because it "makes sense".

I can tell you that this is FAR more complicated than you can know, and indeed when it's all figured out we will be looking at a huge pile of what for you now are "unknown unknowns" - i.e., stuff you know absolutely nothing about or even that it exists, and would never guess could have anything to do with this.

I have been deep diving over the last year in science I also would have never guessed would be relevant and, if it was crazy for me, you can be sure you won't get it figured out by thinking that it "makes sense".

So, what I'm saying here is that this should interest every breeder, but until we get it figured out, you should assume - as I do - that you know nothing about it. I will continue to be circumspect about what I say about this until we start nailing down pieces with enough data to feel comfortable that we have it right. In the meantime, please help me try to prevent the spread of "information" unsupported with facts, and especially step on the fingers of those trying to pass as Facebook "experts".

If this really interests you and you would like to participate in some citizen science to learn more, you do that by participating in the Traction Mat testing and we will work on the dark whelping thing at the same time.
